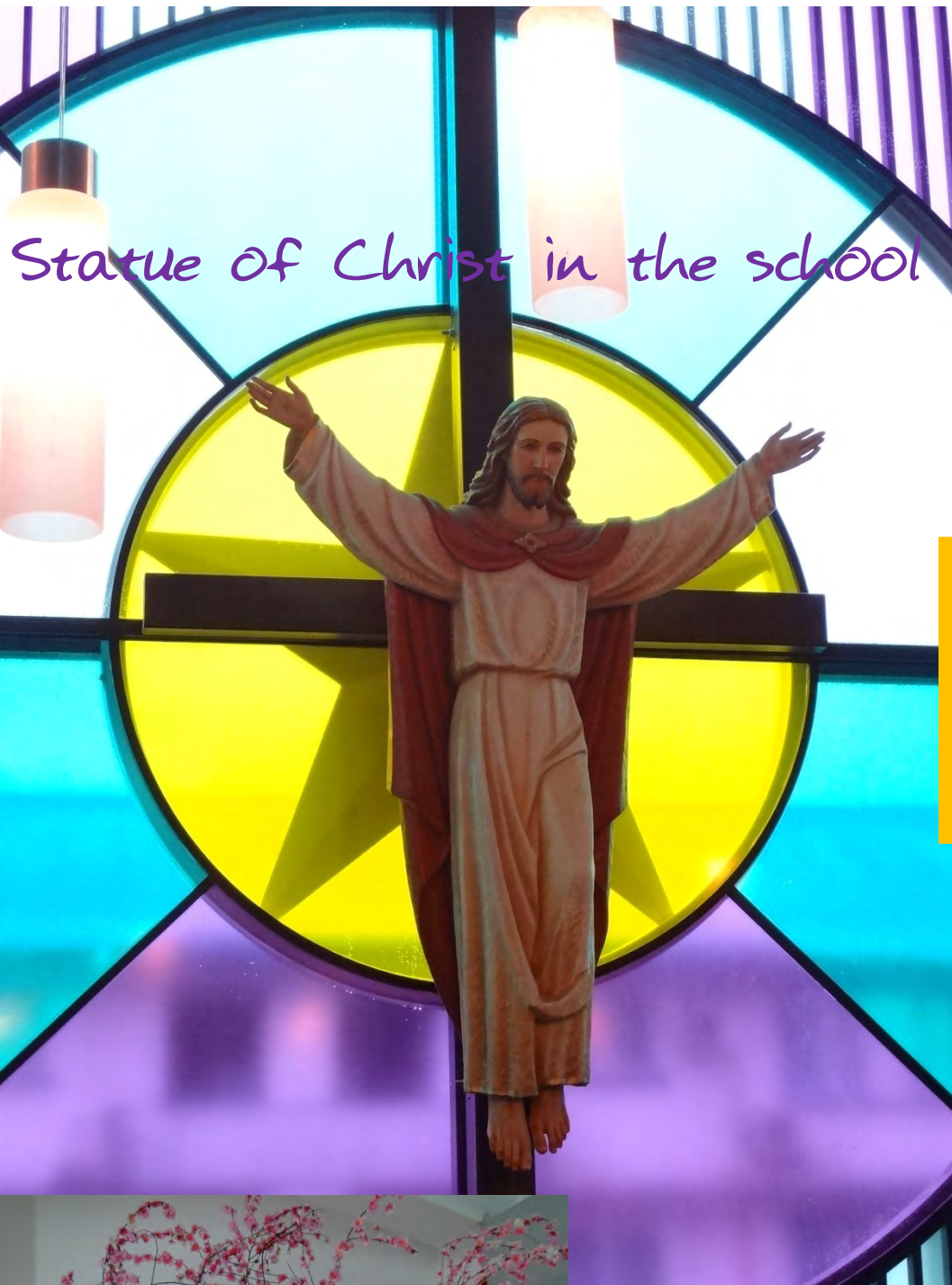
SCHOOL YEAR MASS
